

## FINAL THE SPUT

Look for pinch pionts – Narrow corridors of cover between bedding and feeding areas to set up your scrape. Good scrape location takes into consideration prevailing winds, likely stand locations, and a good overhanging branch.



ample deer urine on the scrape itself. In early season, use tarsal scent sparingly, but as the rut gets closer, increase the amount of tarsal scent. During the rut tarsal scent and urine should dominate the scent.



the area you're hunting – they are tempting targets on heavily trafficked public ground.

Position your stand(s) to take advantage of the prevailing winds and

and camouflage them as appropriate to

the deer activity you observe on camera. Be sure to keep scent and disturbance to a minimum when setting stands and monitoring the scrape. Clean out the scrape and reapply scents as weather and deer activity dictate. Keep in mind the progression of the season and proportion your scents accordingly.

Consider carefully when and how you hunt the scrape. Only when the wind and approach conditions are exactly right should you hunt a particular scrape. You don't want to make your investment of time and energy all for naught by alerting deer to your presence.
